## TE HAKARI TAPU

*(the Eucharist Service  
in Te Reo Maori)*

The Cathedral will host a  
new joint venture between  
the Hawke's Bay Region  
of Waiapu Diocese and  
Te Matau-a-Maui Rohe  
(HB Region of Pihopa-  
tanga ki te Tairawhiti).  
The first service will be  
held at **5.30 pm on  
Thursday 5th August;**  
and it is planned to con-  
tinue on the first and third  
Thursdays in August, Sep-  
tember and October.  
This is an opportunity to  
experience our unique  
partnership, to learn or  
improve our pronuncia-  
tion and confidence in  
using te reo Maori.  
Bishop David Rice and  
Rev'd John Flavell will  
lead the first service.  
All welcome.
