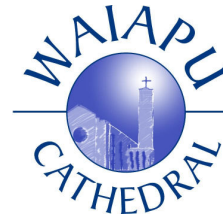

OLD BUTTONS WANTED

Currently there is an exhibition at Te Papa Museum, Wellington, (which will be touring the country over the next two years) focusing on the life of Anne Frank. In conjunction with this exhibition, a Jewish school in Wellington is wanting to build a Holocaust Memorial Sculpture to be installed in Wellington hopefully later this year. Their aim is to collect 1.5 million buttons to feature on the walls of the sculpture. Why 1.5million? Each button is to represent a child killed during the holocaust. Currently they have one million but want more. Gemma and Matthew Eagles are going to help collect buttons to send to the school.
