**A Note from the Archives, by Joan Rogers**

Some of our pulpit carvings have been recognized and explained by two recent visitors to the Cathedral from Northern Ireland. The bottom of each panel depicts **"The Green Man"**, a sculpture often seen in English churches and cathedrals and widely in France. An ancient pagan symbol adopted by the church, he represents fertility and regeneration in his luxuriant foliage, reminding us we can only live in harmony with our natural environment - a message ever more relevant today. No records exist as a clue to his origins - but he is found in many separate cultures. Popular with nineteenth century architects he appears also on secular buildings - often on pub signs!
