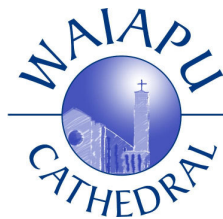

Next Sunday 14 March is AAW Sunday when we celebrate the work of the AAW.

Yesterday, **Saturday 6th March**, St Mary's Church, New Plymouth, became the **Taranaki Cathedral Church of St Mary**, and the Rev'd **Jamie Allen** the first **Dean of Taranaki**. Dean Helen is in Taranaki this weekend to represent Waiapu and to take our greetings and prayers of support. We've made a donation to the new Cathedral's endowment fund. This morning the Taranaki Cathedral's three morning services will be combined for a joint service of Holy Communion at 9.30 am - at which the newly installed Cathedral Kaumatua, Archdeacon Tiki Raumatia, will gather people in welcome; Bishop Philip Richardson will preside as first Bishop of Taranaki; Archbishop John Sentamu, the Archbishop of York, will preach. Taranaki's week-end of celebrations began with a prayer vigil, and will end the same way. At 11.00 pm Archbishop John Sentamu will preside at a Eucharist which will be linked up by video with churches in the United Kingdom for their 10.00 am Sunday service ... and they will break bread together - *"for though we are many, we are one body"*. In the weekly newsletter from Taranaki, they have shared their appreciation, and have felt blessed, for receiving messages of greeting and support from Cathedrals from around the world - Brecon Cathedral, UK; Baguio, Philippines; Saskatchewan, Canada; Bloemfontein, South Africa; Nicosia, Cyprus - thanks be to God for our Worldwide Communion!
