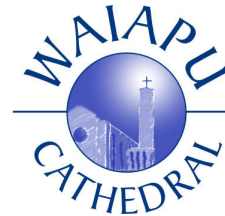

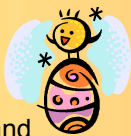


GOOD FRIDAY APPEAL
