

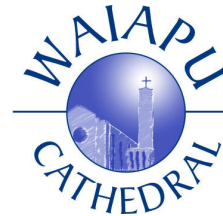

Vestry News

Vestry met this week and began planning for the AGM **Sunday 30 May**. Elections will be held for Vestry members (up to 10), Cathedral Chapter (2, elected for a 3 year term) and Synod Rep (1 elected for a 2 year term), and People's Warden (1 elected every year).

Vestry has general oversight of the day to day running of the parish; Chapter does the big picture, long term planning and mission of the Cathedral. The Synod rep attends the annual Diocesan Synod on behalf of the parish.

Nominations will close **Sunday 23 May**, please pray about who should be our leaders for the next year.

Reports for the AGM need to be in by **9 May**. Any parish group can provide a report, a good chance to take stock and to record our activities.

GENERAL SYNOD

The 59th session of the General Synod/Te Hinota Whanui begins in Gisborne on Saturday 8th May and will continue through the following week. The Anglican Covenant will be a major topic for discussion - in houses (bishops, clergy, and lay) and tikanga (Maori, Pakeha, and Polynesia), and in plenary sessions. It is also hoped to announce the new Bishop of Polynesia following their electoral Synod in Suva on 29th April.

EPISCOPAL ORDINATION

Last Saturday 17 April, the great doors of Holy Trinity Cathedral swung open in celebration after the **Rt Rev Ross Bay** knocked three times to be installed as the 11th Bishop of Auckland. It was a day of joy and celebration with a full cathedral of approximately 1200 people who greeted the new bishop with long applause after he was vested and given the symbols of episcopal ministry. The pastoral staff used by the new bishop to knock on the doors had been presented to Bishop William Cowie in 1890 by the clergy of Auckland to mark his 21st year as Bishop of Auckland. The same staff was laid down on the altar by the previous Bishop of Auckland, the Rt Rev John Pater-son, when he retired in March this year. During the service, symbols of ministry were presented to Bishop Bay by representatives of the northern, central, and southern regions of the diocese. Colleagues of the new Bishop, volunteer members of the Auckland Fire Police of which Ross is a member, attended. Bishop David Rice and Dean Helen Jacobi represented Waiapu Diocese. As Bishop Bay left the cathedral he was greeted by a haka from students from King's College on the cathedral forecourt.
