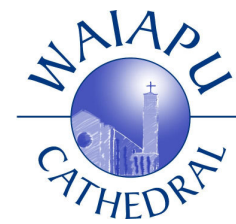

CATHEDRAL CHOIR ON TOUR

They led services at St George's, Gate Pa, St Peter's, Mt Maunganui, St John's, Te Puke, and St Andrew's, Taupo; and were enthusiastically received at each venue.

AGM

Our AGM will be **Sunday 30 May**. Elections will be held for Vestry members (up to 10), Cathedral Chapter (2, elected for a 3 year term) and Synod Rep (1 elected for a 2 year term), and People's Warden (1 elected every year).

Vestry has general oversight of the day to day running of the parish; Chapter does the big picture, long term planning and mission of the Cathedral. The Synod rep attends the annual Diocesan Synod on behalf of the parish.

Thanks to the team of Pastoral Companions and clergy who took services and were available all day last Friday at the Ormond Chapel open day, as we commemorated the first anniversary of the Chaucer Road siege.

Last Thursday Bishop David dedicated our new **Aumbry** in memory of Nola Moroney. An aumbry is a small cupboard where consecrated bread, wine and oils are kept between services and for home communions. Nola left a bequest, some of which has been used to purchase the aumbry. It has been made for us by Don Alexander who also made the candle stands and new lectern. The new aumbry is located on the wall above the credence (side) table and below the organ console

GENERAL SYNOD

The 59th session of the General Synod/Te Hinota Whanui began in Gisborne yesterday and will continue all next week. The Anglican Covenant will be a major topic for discussion - in houses (bishops, clergy, and lay) and tikanga (Maori, Pakeha, and Polynesia), and in plenary sessions.

And we await the announcement of the new Bishop of Polynesia following their electoral Synod in Suva on 29th April.
