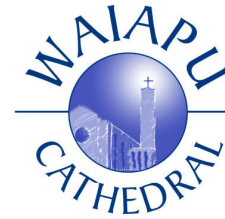

AGM

Our AGM will be **Sunday 30 May**. Elections will be held for Vestry members (up to 10), Cathedral Chapter (2, elected for a 3 year term) and Synod Rep (1 elected for a 2 year term), and People's Warden (1 elected every year). Vestry has general oversight of the day to day running of the parish; Chapter does the big picture, long term planning and mission of the Cathedral. The Synod rep attends the annual Diocesan Synod on behalf of the parish. Nominations close at mid-day next **Sunday 23 May**. Please pray about who should be our leaders for the next year. WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

The period between Ascension Day (last Thursday 13th May) until the Day of Pentecost (next Sunday 23rd May) is known in the church calendar as "The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity". It is a time of prayer and preparation to celebrate the outpouring of the Spirit at Pentecost.

WINSTON HALAPUA BECOMES ARCHBISHOP

It was announced on Thursday at General Synod meeting in Gisborne, that Bishop Winston Halapua is to become the new Bishop of Polynesia, and, therefore, one of the three Archbishops of the Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand, and Polynesia. Bishop Winston succeeds the late Bishop Jabez Bryce who had led the Diocese of Polynesia for 35 years, and who died in February this year. Bishop Winston is married to Sue, who is also an ordained priest (in the Diocese of Auckland) and they have two adult sons. The new diocesan Bishop of Polynesia will be ordained and installed at Suva's Holy Trinity Cathedral on 1st August this year. See the noticeboard for full report.

GENERAL SYNOD

The 59th session of the General Synod/Te Hinota Whanui has been meeting in Gisborne for the past week. Some of the Media releases are on the notice-board ... or check out the Anglican Taonga website - www.anglicantaonga.org.nz Some snippets from General Synod ...

- ♦ Sweeping changes are in store for St John's College, the provincial Anglican theological college. General Synod adopted the Reeves Commission report into the structure of the College.
- ♦ General Synod delegates voted to take immediate action in the face of the severe financial difficulties that threaten the viability of the two Maori Anglican schools in HB, Te Aute College and Hukarere College
- ♦ Delegates passed a motion calling on the Government to honour its commitment to the Millennium Development Goals and increase NZ's overseas aid to 0.7% of GDP by 2015.
