## **CATHEDRAL PARISH CELEBRATES 150 years - 2-4 March 2012**

Did you know that ...

- \* In 1860 a Committee of Anglicans purchased the land for the first church here for £650 and the church that was built cost £700;
- \* in 1861 the ladies held a "fancy bazaar" to help with the fundraising; it was postponed a week for bad weather but £200 was raised
- \* and "sittings", ie pew rents, could be purchased £1 each;
- \* the first church seated 153 people
- \* the church was enlarged twice and by 1883 there were 57 services of Holy Communion with an average attendance of 87; 117 baptisms; 40 "churchings" (of women after childbirth); 25 marriages and 68 burials.

### Clergy “comings and goings” ...

It's been announced that the current Vicar of Havelock North, **Rev'd Brian Dawson**, is to leave Waiapu later in the year to take the position of Vicar at the inner city parish of St Peter's, Willis Street, in Wellington. Brian has been in Havelock North since 2003 and Rotorua as Priest Assistant prior to that.

Brian's involvement in Waiapu has included six years on the Diocesan Standing Committee, representing the diocese at General Synod, General Synod Standing Committee, and the Tikanga Pakeha Liturgical Working Group, youth ministry governance in Bay of Plenty, Hawke's Bay and at a diocesan level, and as a regular contributor to Waiapu News. The exact timing of his and Kirsten's (who is completing her PhD studies this year) departure isn't certain yet, but will probably be in the second half of the year.

The **Rev'd Graeme Pilgrim** has also announced his retirement from his role as Vicar of St Matthew's Parish, Hastings, effective from the end of April.

The **Rev'd Arthur Bruce** will be installed as the Vicar of Opotiki Parish in a service at Hiona St Stephen's Church on Wednesday 1st February at 7.00pm; and the **Rev'd John Hebenton** will be installed as the new Vicar of Gate Pa Parish in a service at St George's Church on Tuesday 21 February at 7.00 pm.

### Youth Intern

We are pleased to announce that the Cathedral will be welcoming one of the Diocesan Youth Interns for a three month placement on 10 February. **Saachi Kepa** is from Gisborne and a member of Holy Trinity. She has just completed High School and this is a “gap” year. Interns are placed in different parishes across the Diocese and get involved in all aspects of parish life. Saachi will be commissioned at the Diocesan service in the Cathedral on **Sunday 12 February at 2.00pm**.
