

On Thursday this week our Cathedral bell tolled 80 times, the sound ringing out over the city at the time the earthquake struck on the 3rd February 1931, and coincided with the civic service being held at the soundshell. And around 900 students were in the Cathedral on Friday for the HB Earthquake 80th anniversary commemorations organized by the Art Deco Trust. Clergy House, McDonald Street

The Cathedral Parish owns a house in McDonald Street which has, in the past, been the home of the curate or second clergy person in the parish. Since the Rev'd Jan Tarrant's departure, the house has been rented. In December, Vestry and Standing Committee (of the Diocese) decided to sell the house. The capital will be used for some major work needed at the Deanery on the slumping driveway and garage, and to repay the Diocese for the loan still outstanding for the demolition of the hall. Remaining capital will be invested along with our other investments managed by the Waiapu Board of Diocesan Trustees.

COMMUNITY CHRISTMAS LUNCH

We have received a letter of thanks from Louise Anderson (the All Saints' coordinator of the Christmas lunch); she writes ... *"we were pleased with the overwhelming support by the community at large as we were inundated with people ringing up to see if they could help. We ended up with 57 helpers either helping on the day before with setting tables, vegetable peeling or decorating, or on the day itself. Slightly fewer than the 87 expected guests arrived; we heard some amazing stories; the guests were grateful to have company and a wonderful meal. We'll learn from our first experience and be planning for the next event."*

The Story behind the Picture

In the mid-1990's the Cathedral Parish sponsored a refugee family from Cambodia to Napier. At that time there were already a number of Cambodian/Laotian families living here. The Cathedral Parish's family were Oun and Toy Nirakone and their two small daughters, the youngest of whom had been born in the refugee camp in Cambodia. A group of parishioners, including Stan and Sue Cosham, set about welcoming the family to Napier and helping them to settle in. Stan's role was to teach Oun English, and Sue's was to teach Toy. A job was found for Oun at Firth Concrete, not one he particularly enjoyed, as he was a graphic artist in his own country! In time, he applied to the EIT as an art teacher, but sadly his English was still not good enough for a teaching position. Meanwhile the Cathedral had purchased art materials for him so that he could do some painting in his spare time. These were displayed in a coffee shop in Emerson Street and were for sale. To thank Stan and Sue for their help to the family, Oun gave them a painting which they treasured. It is very restful, painted from memory of the country he left behind and loved.

Sue is now offering the painting to be auctioned in the Parish, the funds to go towards the Organ Restoration. A reserve of \$150 has been set. Please place your name and contact details and your bid on the clip board.
