Did you know that ...

- * In 1883 "**The Ladies' Work Society**" was formed to raise money to pay for the land the first church was built on
- * It later became "**The Dorcas Society**" to sew clothes for those in need. They remained in existence until 1982.
- * Over the decades they sewed clothes, supported children's homes, the children of Maori clergy, sent clothes parcels to England in the World Wars.
- * Their records show they ran a very efficient operation with sewing machines and equipment in the Parish Hall, making about 20,000 garments in their 100 years of existence.
- * Another group, "**The Council of Good Neighbours**", ran jumble sales in the 1970s and these, and the work of the Dorcas Society, were the predecessors of our Op Shop.
