Bishop David introduces Cursillo 2011

In April and May the Diocese of Wellington will be gifting **Cursillo** to Waiapu. Cursillo is the worldwide, lay-led movement within the Anglican Church which has enlivened the faith of many throughout our communion.

From the 28th April to 1st May, a women's gathering will be held at Lindisfarne College, Hastings, and the 19th to 22nd May will be the men's weekend at Riverbend in Hawke's Bay. I anticipate that most participants involved in these weekends will come from Hawke's Bay because of the location of both weekends, however, I do want to invite and encourage Clergy and Laity throughout the Diocese to consider this experience.
