A very warm WELCOME to all who are worshipping with us today -- especially if you are visiting Napier or at the Cathedral for the first time. You are welcome to stay for morning tea after the 10.00 am service.

And at **5.00 pm** this afternoon, we host a **Civic Service for Japan** - remembering those affected by the earthquake and tsunami in Japan on 11 March 2011 - the service has been planned, and will be presented, in partnership with the Napier City Council, the Japan Society of HB and the Cathedral; will include music, speakers, songs, and prayers (in the Buddhist and Christian traditions), and an opportunity to burn incense and light candles. Donations may be made to the Red Cross "Japan Earthquake" Appeal at the service. All welcome.

Next Sunday we begin **Holy Week** with our **Palm Sunday** service. We begin at the Sound-shell at **9.30am** with a Palm Sunday Procession led by our donkey. The service continues at the Cathedral from 10am.

The making of Palm Sunday crosses will happen on Friday 15 April at 2pm in the Lounge. Please bring sturdy scissors. Last year there were not many helpers; please come if you can. And we need lots of flax for the making of the crosses; this can be dropped off on Friday morning. One of our main flax supplies is no longer available, so everyone please raid your gardens.

We have received a card from **Dean Peter Beck** thanking us for the message book and children's cards which were made for Christchurch Cathedral. He says "there is no normality or business as usual and in the midst of this we work to relieve the distress of so many."

LENT

The season of Lent began on **Ash Wednesday, 9 March**. Lenten Eucharist services continue Wednesday mornings at 7.00 am, and Thursday lunch-times at 12.15 pm during Lent.

At 7.00 pm on **Wednesday** evenings, we combine with the other Napier Inner-City churches for an ecumenical Lenten service on the theme "**Out of the Ashes**" - **this week hosted by St Paul's Presbyterian Church**, Tennyson St.

Our **Stations of the Cross** paintings are again on display in the Cathedral during Lent - come in during the week to walk the stations - brochure on back table.

And note especially the Maundy Thursday Dinner 21 April at 6.00 pm at Asher Hall: please sign up today!

PRAISE BE is celebrating 25 years of broadcasting with a two-part special of archival footage from each year.

An estimated 47,000 people have sung on the programme; more than 4000 hymns and songs of worship recorded in a total of 175 New Zealand churches and venues; watched by an average weekly audience of 70,000 people. The largest congregation featured was 5000 people at the Christchurch Rotary Massed Children's Choir; the smallest vocal group was the four-man Musical Island Boys.

The 25th birthday celebration programmes have been split into two eras. This morning's programme featured footage from 1986-98, and next Sunday (17 April) there will be material recorded from 1999 to 2010 - TV One, 8.00 am.
