This historic parish in the eastern Bay of Plenty sits in the midst of painful stories of Maori-Pākeha relationships dating back to the 1860's and the events that later triggered the diocesan bishop to move from Gisborne to Napier.

Parishioners know about the cost of reconciliation. The Mokomoko-Volkner story is a symbol of that cost. It is a parish well engaged with the wider community, with deep family and historical connections, a range of Anglican Care programmes, and tries to provide creative worship within a traditional framework.

The ministry team at Hiona-Stephens: Reverends Arthur Bruce (Vicar), David Kibblewhite and Elsie Walker; with Parish Wardens - Simon Dondi and Sue Watson; and vestry members.

The parish is currently focused on exploring a respite/daycare centre for the elderly; a newly developed adult bereavement support group; re-kindling the relationship with the Torere congregation; planning for next year's celebrations of 150 years of parish life.

It is especially thankful for the children at worship – their life, vibrancy and enthusiasm, and the faithfulness of long-time worshippers.
