Vestry News

Last week Vestry gathered for a special meeting to discuss progress to date and the next stage of the planned organ rebuild. Vestry congratulate the organ fundraising group on reaching \$578,000. This nearly completes stage one of the fundraising (\$618,000) and Vestry have agreed to proceed to stage two which will complete the additions to the organ (the pipes for the "Solo Organ"), bringing the total needed to \$746,000. The Organ Group continues to make grant applications and, with your help, is confident of making the target by next year. More information about donating pipes for the Solo Organ will be available soon.

- * received with regret the resignation of Shirley Pope as Parish Nurse; Shirley had been on sick leave for a while and has decided not to return to this ministry;

**Lunch with Dr Edric Baker
Thursday, 24 May, 12 noon
St Luke's, Havelock North**

The St Luke's (Havelock North) Mission Guild invites you to lunch in the Parish Lounge to meet Dr Edric Baker and hear him speak of his work at Kailakuri Healthcare Project in Central Bangladesh.

Kailakuri Healthcare Centre provides healthcare and community support to a very poor area with a mixed population of Bengali Muslim and minority indigenous groups: the Mandi (many of whom are Christian) and the Borman (Hindu), who previously had little to do with one another. Now they work together harmoniously for the good of their community.

As founder and chief medical officer of Kailakuri, it is Dr Edric's belief that to help the poor effectively, you have to fully identify with them. He lives very simply in similar accommodation to the rest of the local community and eats the same food.

Admission by koha (donation) - to go towards the work of Kailakuri.
