St John the Baptist Church is a small town parish serving a large rural hinterland. Its worship is traditional with openness to a more contemporary style and child-friendly services. The parish engages with the community through its Opportunity Shop and by hosting many community organisations in its hall and lounges.

**Ministry Team:** Currently (until 31<sup>st</sup> May) the Vicar is the Rev'd Brian Hamilton; and from 1<sup>st</sup> June care of the parish will be with the team of the Rev'ds Joan Minchin, Ruth and Doug St George in the interim period.

**Worship:** Sundays - 8am traditional Communion & hymns; 10am: Family Eucharist using the NZ Prayer Book. Wednesday - 10.30am: Eucharist.

**Issues, challenges & new projects currently part of the parish life:** Ministering in a depressed community suffering the effects of the PSA virus in the local kiwifruit industry; difficulties in reaching young families.

**We give thanks for:** The work of the Kauri Centre and its relationship with the parish. The Kauri Centre offers activities every Wednesday & Thursday in the Parish Hall for the aged and infirm, giving caregivers an opportunity to have some time out.

**Outreach:** Community Care Shop supports individuals and groups in Te Puke, and 'Growing through Grief'. The Kauri Centre (Anglian Care day-care/respite for elderly and those coping with early-stage dementia) operates from the parish hall 2 days a week.

**Highlights:** Advent & Ash Wednesday services with Roman Catholics & Tikanga Maori; Advent evensong; Christmas services; Holy Week; patronal festival Evensong; bi-annual garden ramble and church fair.
