A very warm WELCOME to all who are worshipping with us today -- especially if you are visiting Napier or at the Cathedral for the first time. You are welcome to stay for morning tea after the 10.00 am service.

At 10.00 am today, we welcome the Woodford House choir, staff, students and families who are joining us for worship for their annual service in the Cathedral.

Rev'd Oenone Woodhams, the Diocesan Ministry Educator is the preacher at today's Cathedral services.

Dean Helen is away from the Parish (see *"Preaching" note on right*) and the Rev'd Dorothy Brooker is Priest-in-Charge during Dean Helen's absence.

Rev'd Richard Spence is with the Cur-sillo men's group at Riverbend Camp this weekend (a Diocesan faith-formation event); and the Rev'd Dorothy Brooker preaches and presides at the 11am Ormond Chapel service this morning.

ANGLICAN-METHODIST COVENANT

Today, we acknowledge the work of the NZ Anglican-Methodist Dialogue Group.

A comment from their final report ... "The focus of the Dialogue Group was to explore the concept of "covenant". Like the British Anglican-Methodist Covenant, ours would affirm what we had already achieved, acknowledge what we had not, and express our commitment to continue to work towards specific goals in these areas. Unlike the British covenant, ours would need to reflect the three ti-kanga structure of our Anglican Church and our Methodist church's bi-cultural structure." The next stage is to move closer in fellowship and mission, and for on-going theological conversation.

PREACHING

Dean Helen is now in the United States attending the Festival of Homiletics in Minneapolis. She will be away from the Parish until Saturday 28 May. Her conference fee and accommodation has been funded by the Barbara Leatham Trust for Diocesan training and the Parish.

The Festival of Homiletics is a week of sermons, worship and lectures by many of the "big name" preachers such as Barbara Brown Taylor, Walter Brueggeman, Thomas Long, Anna Carter Florence, Otis Moss, William Willemon and many more.

Dean Helen is enjoying hearing from some of the writers she studied for her DMin thesis. She emailed the Office during the week ... has had two full days of amazing preaching and lectures, with the high-light (so far!) being Walter Brueggemann preaching a powerful sermon on *"how we are silenced as preachers and often aren't brave enough to preach justice and the gospel"*! Dean Helen is also enjoying lots of liturgy and music (a four manual organ in the church where the conference is based), and being in a packed church which seats 2000!

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Advance notice that the AGM of the Cathedral Parish will be held on **Sunday 26 June 2011, following the 10.00 am Choral Eucharist service in the Cathedral.**

Group leaders - please have your reports into the Parish Office by the **10th June** so that a booklet of reports can be prepared prior to the meeting.

We will soon be undertaking a review of parishioners details held on the Parish roll and compiling a new "Electoral" roll as required by the Diocesan Canons, ie each parish is required to maintain two rolls - one a "**Pastoral**" roll for the purpose of mission and outreach, and lists those who are voluntarily associated with the parish, irrespective of age or baptism; the second is an "**Electoral**" roll for voting purposes. This roll consists of baptized parishioners who have participated in worship and parish life for the last four months, and have completed an enrolment form, or are known by the Vicar and Wardens to qualify. Only those who have enrolled on the electoral roll shall be entitled to vote at parish meetings.
