Our focus parish this week is Holy Trinity, Tauranga.

Holy Trinity, Tauranga is a very large parish serving the central city. Worship is varied covering a wide spectrum. The parish operates within a charismatic/evangelical tradition with a large team of paid staff, led by co-vicars, Paul and Dale Williamson. There are 26 clergy and lay in the ministry team. Music is lively and current. LifeGroup membership is encouraged. Children & Youth Ministries are fully catered for. The main Sunday morning service offers Family Communion with contemporary preaching, music & media.

The parish also includes All Saints, Maungatapu where there is a monthly service with Tikanga Maori.

Holy Trinity's mission statement is "Transforming Lives and Communities". They aim to grow more effective in reaching people in the community and seeing them transformed through a new relationship with Christ. That's an everyday challenge. Good connections into the community help in meeting the needs of those who are struggling and marginalised.

We give thanks for the ministry of the Reverend Brian Hamilton - Brian's last service at Te Puke Parish is this morning. His longstanding and faithful service will be acknowledged as he is farewelled; also his wife, Susie, who has been a faithful support throughout Brian's years of ministry.

Brian served as a Curate Assistant at Havelock North from 1972 to 1975, moving to Tauranga in 1976 to serve as a Curate Assistant at Holy Trinity, Tauranga. From 1977 to 1981 he worked as the Vicar of Wairoa Parish, and Priest-in-Charge of the Mohaka, and Nuhaka Maori Pastories; he moved to Edgecumbe/Kawerau as Vicar in 1981; and from 1988 to 2007 Brian served as Vicar of Holy Trinity, Tauranga, before taking on the role of Vicar of Te Puke Parish in 2008. Since 2006, he has also served as Vicar-General of the Waipū Diocese, and will continue to serve in this role after his retirement from parish ministry.

LUNCH - 9 JUNE

VESTRY - The Vestry met last Wednesday and made several important decisions that we'll be acting on in the days ahead. They include ...

- ♦ the opening of a place of daily prayer and reflection inside the nave to be called **The Resurrection Chapel**. This will be in the second of the two rooms used by children in the south west corner;
- ♦ the children's Sunday programme will be re-located and take over the former prayer room next to the parish lounge, in the south-eastern end of the cathedral;
- ♦ the refurbishing of the south ambulatory corridor as an historical display area;
- ♦ the lighting (from the inside) of the heritage window at the main entrance so it can be seen by all who enter the cathedral.

These projects require little cost and are included in our maintenance budget, but the final and biggest undertaking, and the most important for parishioners reliant on wheelchairs, or limited in their mobility, is...

- ♦ the creation of a south side ramp up to the chancel altar and Maori Chapel. We will need to find donations of at least **\$5000** to enable this project to begin. Please let Bishop John know if you are interested in contributing. The ramp would make a huge difference to those who find the chancel steps difficult, dangerous, and, for some, impossible.
