OUR FOCUS PARISH THIS WEEK IS ST ANDREW'S, TAUPŌ

The ministry of this lakeside parish is led by the Rev'd Peter Minson, (Vicar), and Jenny Lewis (Families Ministry).

The parish works hard at growing ministry among younger families; sustaining the community-facing ministries its worshippers are involved in; and developing the contemporary edge of music and worship. The parish holds together a wide range of views and a willingness to listen; ethos is clearly Anglican.

It is a mainly Pākehā with some Māori families; occasional sharing with Roman Catholics and other Tikanga; church used for large tangi; tourists from other cultures often join worship; some Te Reo used on Sunday. There are a range of programmes for children and young people, lots of community outreach through foodbank, op shop, eze meals, guitar classes. St Andrews is one of the few parishes to still provide a regular men's group (AMSOC).

The church is the chosen Taupō venue for acoustic concerts for up to 200. Highlights of parish life include an annual garden walk; golf tournament; parish dinners; annual market day.

KOHUPATIKI MARAE

A weekend of celebrations for the Centenary of the Meeting House concludes today!

Kohupatiki Marae, (off Farndon Road, Clive), shares a significant history with the Diocese of Waiapu as both the Marae and the Diocese hosted the Bishop of Aotearoa position between 1928 and 1968. Both Pihopa Fredrick Bennett and Pihopa Wiremu Panapa lived at the Bishop's Home at Kohupatiki while being Bishop of Aotearoa suffragan to the Diocese of Waiapu. The Marae and the Diocese still maintain a unique and warm bond.

From last Thursday until today, Sunday 16th June, Kohupatiki's Meeting House "*Tanenuiarangi*" has been celebrating its 100th birthday.

Waiapu people attended with Bishop David Rice on Friday afternoon; and at 10am this morning, an Ecumenical Church Service is being held.

PILGRIMAGE TIME
