This week, 180 ministers and 50,000 activists, businesses representatives and NGOs will meet in Brazil for the Rio+20 UN conference on sustainable development – considered one of the most important meetings on the environment to be held. The Most Rev'd Mauricio Andrade, the Anglican Primate of the host nation, itself currently in the grip of a devastating drought, has made an appeal to fellow Anglicans around the world to support this conference. *The full text of the Archbishop's message is on the notice-board.*

a Cathedral Winter-Spring Study!

A new study group, to be offered in late winter, will be of interest to Anglicans who have been New Zealanders all their lives; and even more so for those who are newer NZers! This is the fifth study in the series that began with the Old and New Testament stories, and covered the Church's story and especially the English story. Where *WE* are in NZ is the focus of this study. It's a "stand-alone" study - you don't need to have completed any of the previous studies to do this one! Study books offer plenty of food for thought - buy them now and get the reading started in the long winter evenings, \$15 each from the Parish Office - together with suggestions for keeping notes, questions for group discussion, etc. The group will meet for six sessions on **Sundays 4.30 pm - 6.00 pm** in the upstairs **Choir Room** at the Cathedral, commencing on the **5th August**.

Fr Charles Vatu to contest **2012 General Election.**

The head of the Anglican Church in Vanuatu, Rt Rev'd James Ligo, has officially released Fr Charles Vatu to contest the 2012 General Elections in October. The official release was performed in front of over 400 Anglican Church members of Port Vila during a special service administered by Bishop James Ligo at Tagabe Church of the Resurrection on Saturday 26th May 2012.

Fr Charles was presented to Bishop James by Fr Ephraim Mathias of Freshwater Parish, who declared Fr Charles' intention and the support of the Church Councils and Anglican parishioners of Port Vila for him to contest the 2012 General Elections.

Bishop James released Fr Charles back to the community, represented by a chief and uncle and Fr Charles's Candidate Committee chairman, Mr George Faerua.

The official release is in line with the Constitution of the Anglican Church of Melanesia which states that any clergy who wishes to go into politics must be released by his bishop.

While Fr Charles will remain an ordained priest, he was authorised by Bishop James to participate in all the political activities including the political campaign leading up to the General Elections in October 2012.

Fr Charles Vatu was ordained as a priest in the Anglican Church in 2009. He will contest the 2012 General Election as the second candidate of the Graon mo Jastis Pati (GJP) in the Port Vila constituency (along with MP Ralph Regenvanu).
