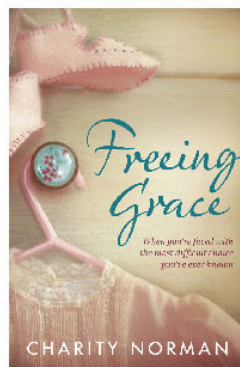
and click on "Catch Up" (as we have started later than the dates scheduled by the Bible Society).
