Week Six's reflections are by Andrew
Becroft, Principal Youth Court Judge.

*This week we have read reading numbers
26-30 - "The Judges". Judges represents a
particularly lawless time in Israel's history.
It covers the period after the Israelites' ini-
tial settlement in the promised land (under
the leadership of Joshua son of Nun), up un-
til the establishment, some hundreds of
years later, of a monarchy - beginning with
King Saul. During that time, the book of
Judges records the deeds of a series of strong
leaders whom God periodically raised up to
lead the Israelite nation. Although called
"Judges", they were leaders rather than
judges in the legal sense we use the word to-
day. In our readings this week we will be in-
troduced to some of the greatest Judges;
Deborah, Gideon and Samson.*

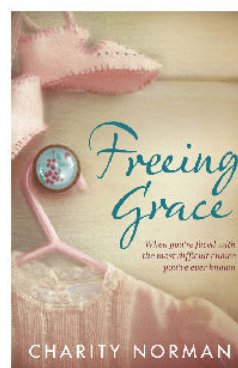
STEWARDSHIP
