A very warm welcome to all who are worshipping with us today - especially if you are visiting Napier or are here for the first time.

During the **10.00 am service** this morning, we will complete our Stewardship campaign by offering our **Stewardship** commitment slip from this year's brochure "*Your commitment: securing our future*".

And, following the final hymn, we will move to the new **Prayer Room for the blessing and dedication** of the Prayer Room and a print (which will hang in the Prayer Room) of a Mountford painting of the St Augustine's Chapel in the first Cathedral, gifted by Lady Pettigrew. At the conclusion of the service, we will have morning tea in the Parish lounge - all welcome.

There is **no 11.00 am** Holy Communion service at **Ormond Chapel** this morning, as we combine both the Ormond Chapel and Cathedral congregations for our Stewardship commitment.

This afternoon, at 5.00 pm, we host the annual ecumenical service for **Sea Sunday** honouring the work of the Mission to Sea-farers and all who work at sea.

Thanks to the Rev'd Dorothy Brooker who has been Priest-in-Charge for the last two week's whilst Dean Helen has been involved with wider church and diocesan commitments (National Hermeneutics Hui & St John's College scholarship funding allocations), and on retreat.

Next Sunday, 18 July, we will welcome the **Rev'd Oenone Woodhams**, the Diocesan Ministry Educator, as preacher at both the 8am & 10am Cathedral services.

Some background information regarding a print being gifted to the Cathedral ...

Benjamin Mountfort was born in England and emigrated to Canterbury NZ in one of the first four ships; he was considered to be the outstanding church architect of his day in this country. He was associated in the planning of Christchurch and Auckland Cathedrals, and was the architect of Waiapu's original Cathedral, considered to be English Gothic at its best. It was built of bricks and stone - despite concern of the possibility of earthquakes!!

A pen and Indian ink drawing on paper of St Augustine's Chapel was gifted to the HB Museum and Art Gallery by the Canterbury Society of Arts, Christchurch. Over a period of time it showed signs of deterioration which needed specialised conservation. Friends of the HB MAG instituted an "Adopt-a Painting" project to gain sponsorship for this work. Due to the generosity of Glennis, Lady Pettigrew, this important art work has been fully restored by the conservation team at Auckland Museum and returned to Hawke's Bay. It is Lady Pettigrew's wish that this be donated to Waiapu Cathedral and will be presented this morning. It will hang in the Prayer Room.
