VANUATU PILGRIMS' SCHEDULE

The group of twelve parishioners, led by Dean Helen Jacobi and Rev'd Dorothy Brooker, flew from Auckland to Port Vila, Vanuatu, yesterday. Also in the group are: Stephen Jacobi, Michael and Helen Blow, Rose and Jim Usher, Shirley Pope, Anna Zohrab, Vicki Vaughan, Alison Thomson and Robert Nelson.

An outline of their week's mission is as follows:-

Saturday: arrive Port Vila, with rest of afternoon and evening free to settle in;

Sunday: 8.00 am Mass (Dean Helen preaching), followed by an official welcome, then a gathering with members of the Mothers Union;

Monday: 8.00 am - children's programme at Tagabe; afternoon free to travel to Freshwater for 6.00 pm Mass at Freshwater Parish (Dean Helen preaching) followed by a Bible study session;

Tuesday: 7.00 am (before it gets too hot!) - repairs and clean up at Tagabe (buildings and gardens), followed by morning tea and Bible study; afternoon free to travel to Seaside for 6.00 pm Mass at Seaside Parish (Dean Helen preaching) followed by Bible study;

Wednesday: 8.00 am - visit to Melanesian Brothers, offering some practical help as well as them sharing their life; 3.00 pm Mass with Rev'd Dorothy Brooker or Dean Helen celebrating;

Thursday: morning free - 2.00 pm visit to prison and/or hospital;

Friday: 9.00 am - visit Kawenu Training College, followed by a visit to Seafarers; afternoon free before farewell at Tagabe;

Saturday: - morning flight from Vanuatu to Auckland, and travel back to Napier.
