



Today we celebrate **St James and St John**, Apostles, Galilean fishermen and sons of Zebedee.

Along with Peter, they were among the first, and closest, disciples of Jesus. The symbol for St James is the scallop shell - travelers completing the pilgrimage of "The Way of St James" to the Cathedral at Santiago de Compostela, Spain, are given a scallop shell. Whenever St James's day (25 July) falls on a Sunday, the cathedral declares a Holy or Jubilee Year.

I share my faith with someone else? It all feels
