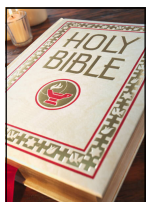

Community of the Sacred Name - after the Christchurch earthquakes

We have heard news about Christchurch Cathedral, the other historic churches and their parishes and even their organs. But what about the only Anglican community of nuns, based in Christchurch? Many Waiapu people have links and associations with this small band of unique women. Rev'd Cherie Baker received a letter recently from Sister Annette with news of their current situation. They have moved out of Christchurch and purchased a house in Ashburton, and moved in June. "This is a good house, with four bedrooms – one each for Sisters Brigid, Anne, Judith and myself," Annette reports. Mother Keleni occupies the 'granny cottage', where she has also set up her office. They currently say the daily office in part of the lounge but hope to soon convert one of the double garages into a chapel. "Our old home in Barbadoes Street is in the process of being demolished. Before the work began we travelled to Christchurch and stood in the garden for a short service of farewell and thanksgiving – very moving, but good. The retreat house is waiting for an engineer's report, but will probably be repaired, as will the chapel. Church people and others here in Ashburton have made us welcome and we hope to be able to offer a ministry here once we are settled".
