A very warm WELCOME to all who are worshipping with us today -- especially if you are visiting Napier or at the Cathedral for the first time.

Today, at the 10am service, we are continuing to experiment with a new way of coming up for communion.

Being aware of those who have difficulty using the stairs to come up for communion, and being aware that most weeks we serve some people separately in the congregation, and wanting to have a sense of all gathering together, we would like to trial a new way.

We will gather along the bottom of the chancel steps - come up the centre aisle and fill in from the far side - by the eagle lectern on the right and the pulpit on the left. Standing is recommended but if you wish to kneel on the bottom step you may. Communion will be served starting at the lectern/ pulpit and moving to the middle. Please leave via the side aisles.

This is very much an experiment which we are trying for 8 weeks and then we will seek feedback on whether we feel this is a good idea. Please reserve your judgement for at least a couple of weeks as it will feel awkward to begin with. But be assured we will listen to the feedback as this may or may not work well.

Please be sure to stand close to the curve of the steps and take your time!
