**A very warm WELCOME to all who are worshipping with us today** -- especially if you are visiting Napier or at the Cathedral for the first time.

**Today, at the 10am service, we are continuing to experiment with a new way of coming up for communion.**

Being aware of those who have difficulty using the stairs to come up for communion, and being aware that most weeks we serve some people separately in the congregation, and wanting to have a sense of all gathering together, we would like to trial a new way.

We will gather along the bottom of the chancel steps - come up the centre aisle and fill in from the far side - by the eagle lectern on the right and the pulpit on the left. Standing is recommended but if you wish to kneel on the bottom step you may. Communion will be served starting at the lectern/ pulpit and moving to the middle. Please leave via the side aisles.

And please be sure to stand close to the curve of the steps and take your time!

This is very much an experiment, which we commenced on the 5th August for a period of 8 weeks; **survey forms are available on the back table from today**, and will be available for another week - please complete and 'post' into the "Surveys" box, or return to the Parish Office. Thanks.

Carrie's funeral was held in the Cathedral of St Mary, New Plymouth, on Friday.

And there are three public presentations, chaired by the Archbishop of Canterbury: Tues. 30 Oct, 7.30pm "Gender-based Violence"; Thurs. 1 Nov, 7.30pm "The Environment"; and Tues. 6 November, 7.30pm "Witness". - ♦ elected **Standing Committee** members: **Clergy**: Rev'ds Alex Czerwonka, Eric Fairbrother, Ron Elder, Joan Edmundson, Jo Crosse; and **Lay**: Susanna Shelton, Ray James, Hugh McBain, Brian Watkins and **Alison Thomson** (Cathedral Parish).

## PARISH EUCHARIST - PET SERVICE

Our next Parish Eucharist service will include the "Blessing of the Pets".

This is usually celebrated on a Sunday close to St Francis Day, 4 October.

You are welcome to bring along your pets - suitably restrained or contained - or a favourite teddy bear / soft toy.

**Leadership for Youth** - is a new programme for young people launched at Synod. It is aimed at those 14 years and older and involves projects undertaken over two years in the five areas of mission: telling our story; faith formation; serving others; social justice; and the care of creation. A badge is awarded at the end of each module and then a Bishop of Waiapu award at the end of the two years. Each young person is accompanied by a mentor, and the young people will participate in camps and other activities as a group. Some of our young people are considering taking this on and we will launch the programme on Youth Sunday, 14 October, at the 10.00 am service.

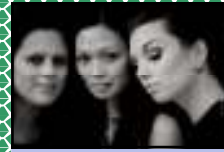
