

IN MEMORIUM

The Venerable **David King**, Archdeacon Emeritus of the Diocese of Waikato, died last week, at the age of 77. David was raised in Napier, ordained priest in 1960, and served in Wellington, Waikato and Waiapu; he was Vicar of Havelock North 1971-1979, and a Canon of Waiapu Cathedral 1976-1979, before continuing his ministry in the Waikato Diocese. He retired to Wellington in 2005, and David and Molly had been living in retirement at Waikanae. His funeral was at St Luke's, Waikanae, on Thursday.

Archbishop David Moxon writes ... "David will be remembered as a very fine parish priest, a true and loyal Anglican, a man of great love, wit, who was deeply interested in life and in the lives of the people amongst whom he ministered. David had a passion for high standards of music, liturgy and hospitality. He was a thorough administrator as well as a conscientious representative of the wider church. Throughout all of his ministry, David was a partner in mission with Molly, his wife. David and Molly together commanded huge respect and were greatly loved."

Annette Milburn (nee Hide), a former Cathedral Choir member and whose family had long connections with the Cathedral Parish. Her funeral was at St George & St John Church, Whakatane.

May they rest in peace and rise in glory.

An extract from a card received last week from the **Rev'd Jan Tarrant** (former Cathedral Pastor), now Vicar of St Paul's Parish, Putaruru - *see the card and photo on the noticeboard* - she writes:

Dear Friends, I have been in the Waikato for 16 months now, but still miss you all and think of you often. I am conscious that only some of you are privy to the expenditure of the generous cash gift you sent me on my way with. The first purchase was a pink tool-kit to aid the move - Conroys were most impressed with it! The next was an electric blanket - last winter was freezing in Putaruru. It hasn't been so bad this year - perhaps I have acclimatized - and the house has not been empty as it was (or had been for 12 months) when I moved in last winter. The next purchase was a Navman to help me find my way in the Waikato fog. I think I've even got Hamilton sorted now - but it was a huge help to me in the early days. I'm still to find Emmaus, however, Helen! Lastly, I purchased this piece of art to remember you all by - the pounamu (or greenstone pendant), a link to the whenua, my roots will always remain deep in Waiapu; the korowai (or feathered cloak) representing nurture, development and kaha (strength) - my journey with you from Curate to Cathedral Pastor. And, of course, the three baskets of knowledge - one for me, one for my whanau, and one for my work. They were certainly filled in my years in the Cathedral Parish. I am finally beginning to feel like a Waikato girl - the Diocesan shift was a big one for me. Thank you one and all for all you are, and all you gifted to me. With love and thanks, Jan.
