Celebrating our Young People

We are blessed with the ministry of young people at the Cathedral. They lead us in worship as choir and choristers; they are readers, intercessors, crucifers, servers, acolytes, assist with Cathedral Kids. They minister in the community as leaders at school, musicians, members of community and environmental groups.

Today we celebrate their ministry and pray for young people across our church and community, not forgetting they are with us every week as we serve and worship together.

Youth Sunday is celebrated each year on the Sunday nearest to the feast day of **Tarore of Waharoa**.

Tarore, the daughter of Ngakuku, the Ngati Haua chief, attended the mission station at Matamata and learned to read. Tragically, on 19 October 1836, at the age of twelve, she was killed during a raid. Her father preached forgiveness at her tangi. The Gospel of Luke that was with her was taken by one of the raiding party, who was subsequently converted and made peace with Ngakuku. Later it was taken to Otaki, where its message led to the conversion of Tamihana Te Rauparaha, who became a missionary to the South Island.
