## **ACC15 in Auckland**

*Dean Helen writes:*

It was a real privilege to be in Auckland for the opening of the ACC Conference. Do read more about the opening ceremony and Eucharist, plus regular reports online at [www.anglicantaonga.org.nz](http://www.anglicantaonga.org.nz)

The welcome was at the Manukau Events Centre. Some 800 young people were there from Anglican schools including Te Aute and Hukarere who were prominent in the welcome party.

The highlight of the morning were the questions from young people answered by the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Presiding Bishop of the US and the Archbishop of Capetown. Ranging from *"If God wore shoes what kind of shoes would they be?"* to *"is it fun being a bishop?"* to *"what do you think about same gender marriage?"*. The three bishops (who had no knowledge of the questions ahead of time) answered with great thought and care and the young people listened intently. For the record, God would wear dancing shoes; or hunter boots to walk a long way with us; or sandals to take off and feel the earth and to give to someone who needed them!

On Sunday we were with 1200 others packed into Holy Trinity Cathedral to

hear the Archbishop preach and to worship with delegates from all corners of the Communion. The service was wonderful with NZ composers chosen for the music and young people again in prominence in leadership. The Archbishop preached on the extravagant love of Jesus which breaks down all barriers. Do read his sermon (printed copies on the back table).

On Sunday afternoon we visited the "Networks Fair" and chatted to people from all over the Communion who were there to update the conference on the work of the Networks such as "Peace and Justice" and "Health"; there are 9 different networks. This included the launch of a book written by young Anglicans "Life Widening Mission", edited by NZer Cathy Ross.

Then followed Evensong and dinner at the Deanery with delegates from Cathedrals: Liberia, Kenya, Australia and Hong Kong.

The delegates have been meeting all week and today are "sent out" to all the Cathedrals and more for Sunday worship.

Tomorrow, Monday, we return to Auckland to be part of the host team for the Tikanga Pakeha Dinner at the Auckland Museum.

## **BOOK LAUNCH - *Our Place, Our Voice* Wednesday 28th November, 5.30 pm in the Cathedral Choir Room**

A new book exploring contextual theology, with chapters written by women in the Anglican Church of Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia ... including a chapter each by the Very Rev'd Dr Helen Jacobi (Dean of Waiapu), the Rev'd Dr Jenny Dawson (Bishop's Chaplain HB), the Rev'd Erice Fairbrother (Vicar of Otumoetai Parish), and the Rev'd Numia Tomoana (Te Matau-a-Maui Rohe)

**The Anglican Diocese of Tarime** is the newest and 26th Diocese in the Anglican Church of Tanzania in Africa, and the youngest. It was inaugurated on July 4, 2010, the day when Dr Mwita Akiri was consecrated as its first Bishop. It has just over 9,000 members in 29 parishes and congregations in a population of 334,000 in Tarime district (according to last national census in 2002). The temporary diocesan offices are located within St Luke's Parish Church in Tarime.

This largely rural Diocese is located east of Lake Victoria, and shares a border with Kenya to the north and north east. It comprises the whole geographical area of Tarime district. The far end of the western part of the Serengeti National Park is in the Tarime district. Visitors to the Diocese who have time to spare should take the opportunity to enjoy the abundant wildlife in Tanzania and rare world wonders such as the Ngorongoro Crater.

The Rt Rev Dr R. Mwita Akiri was elected bishop of Tarime on April 8, 2010, and was consecrated on July 2010. He was ordained 1985. After serving in two parishes, he went to Trinity College (now part of Bristol University, England) and graduated with a BA (Honours) in Theological Studies in 1991. He returned to the diocese of Mara to serve as principal of a diocesan bible college, priest of the

local parish, rural dean of the local deanery, and Bible translator for Bible Societies of Tanzania and Kenya until September 1994 when he went to Edinburgh University to do postgraduate studies in African Christianity. He gained a Master of Theology degree in 1995, and a PhD in 1999 (with a year off for field research). He served as diocesan director of education in the diocese of Mara in 2000.

Bishop Mwita comes to the diocese of Tarime with a variety of national and international experiences. He is the immediate former General Secretary and Chief Executive of the Anglican Church of Tanzania which has its head office in Dodoma central Tanzania. He held this post for almost 10 years with one major achievement (among others) of overseeing the planning and eventually the establishment of St John's University of Tanzania, a national Anglican University. He is a member of the Anglican Consultative Council (ACC) since 2005. He served on the ACC's Finance and Administration Committee from 2005-2009. He is also currently a member of the Advisory Council of the worldwide Anglican Health Network.

Bishop Mwita is married to Mukami. They have two daughters, Mugure and Mbayo.

The service will include -

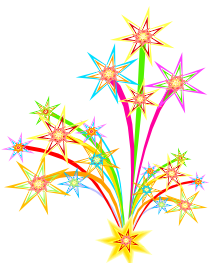
- ♦ a welcome and commissioning of **Peter O'Brien**, the General Manager of Waiapu Anglican Social Services;
