The Diocesan Archives (top floor of bell tower) also are now locked and "out-of-bounds" whilst the Asbestos contaminated material is assessed for removal or paint covering.

“KETE” 3-DAY COURSE

IN ELEMENTARY MAORI

PRONUNCIATION, LANGUAGE AND TRADITION

Mon 7th - Wednesday 9th September

Following on from two very well received cycles in 2013 and one in 2014, this three-day course includes:

- practice of a 90 second personalised per participant ‘mihi’ greeting
- exploration of traditions observed on a marae
- exploration of traditions observed at a tangi
- easy-to-use greetings and farewells in Maori
- exploration of 'Te Tiriti O Waitangi' as an everyday partnership.
