Choral Evensong has its origins in the ancient order of St. Benedict, which required the methodical regular recitation of the Biblical psalms, prayers, and songs from the New Testament and early Church. Evensong is an amalgamation of the two Monastic Services of Vespers and Compline – Vesper meaning 'evening' and Compline from the Latin 'complere' (to fill up) – so called because it 'completed' the service of the day. The present order has remained unchanged for 400 years and in that time a great number of the beautiful musical settings have been composed to enhance the service.

This service is drawn almost completely from the Bible. Its primary purpose is to proclaim the wonderful works of God in history, and in the life and death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Its secondary purpose is to evoke from the worshipper a response of praise, penitence, prayer and obedience. The service is sung in cathedrals, parish churches and collegiate chapels across the globe. It is unique in that it is a living offering of worship and those attending participate not only by what they do in singing hymns or saying Amen to the prayers, but also in that they immerse themselves in an experience of harmony and melody which, though they hear with the ear, is also offered from the heart.

The Congregation stands at the entrance of the procession and remains standing for the Choir to sing the Introit. This sets the theme of the service to follow.

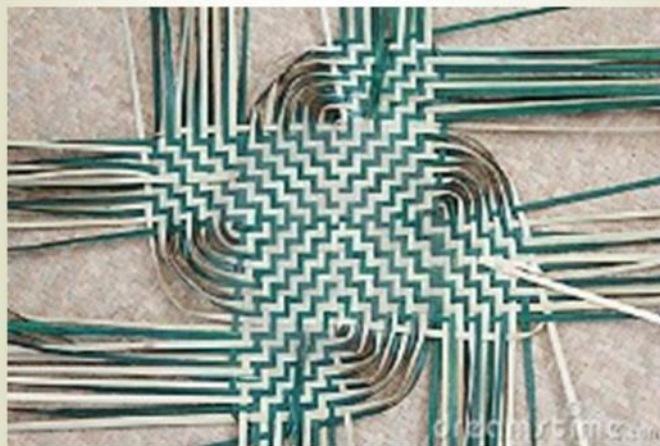
