our path has just begun.

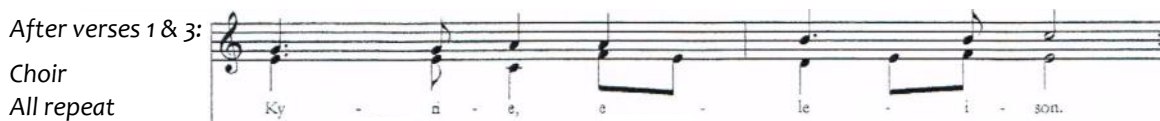

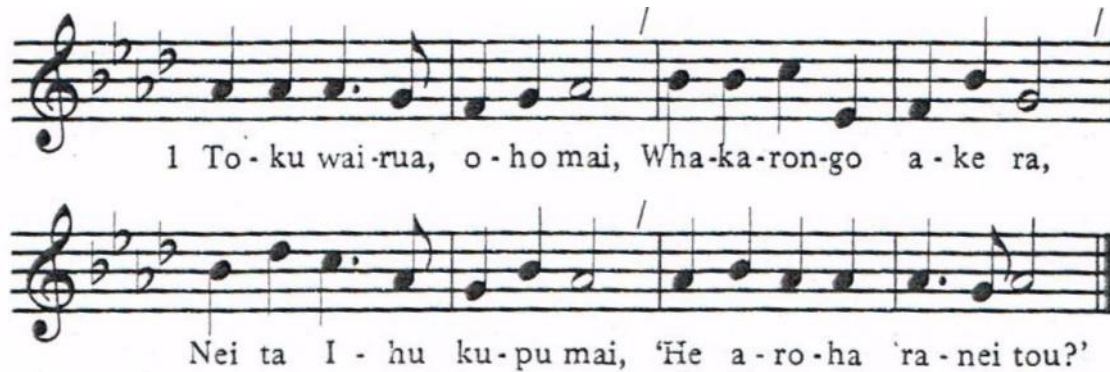
