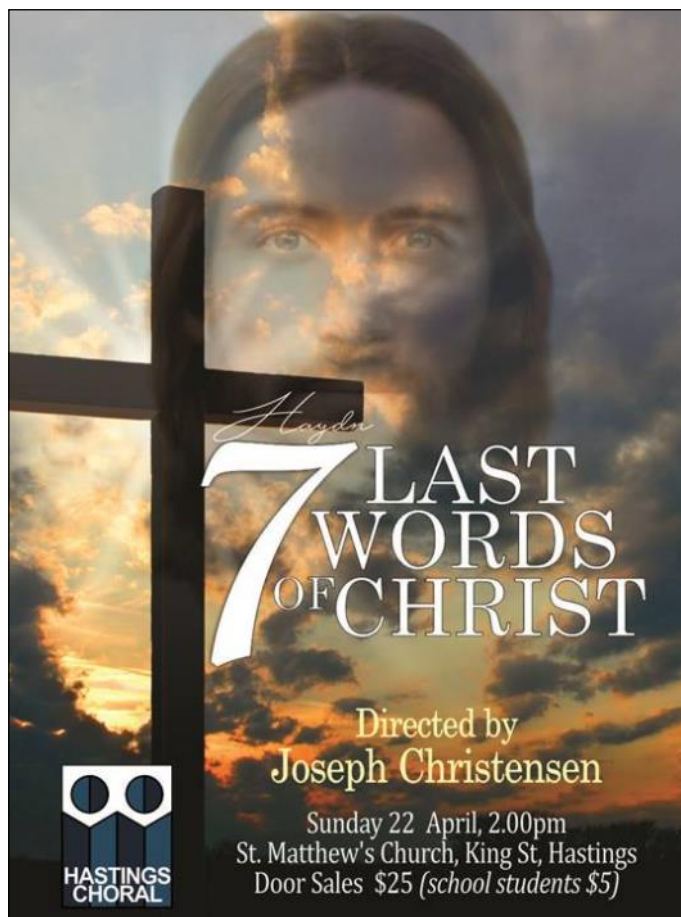
EASTER STUDIES

***Meeting Jesus: transforming encounters
with the risen Lord***

A series of seven studies has been prepared for parishes and individuals to do during the Easter Season, which runs from Easter Day (1 April) until Pentecost (20 May) or, indeed, at any other time.

The studies have been written by the Waiapu Diocesan Theologian, the Rev'd Dr Howard Pilgrim, and the Waiapu Ministry Educator, the Rev'd Deborah Broome, (both of whom also prepared the Waiapu Lenten study *We have a gospel*).

The Easter studies are based around the idea that the stories of the resurrection appearances that we find in the Gospels are also archetypal: these are the ways in which Christians through the ages have encountered the risen Jesus.
