Diocesan Ordination service:

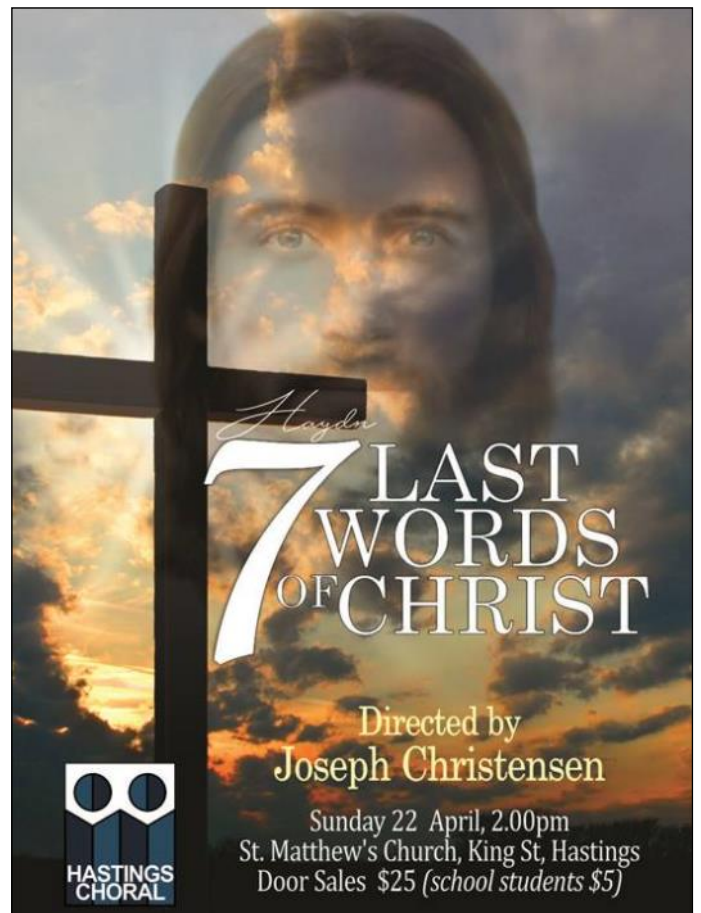
