TODAY'S READINGS ... FROM THE NEW REVISED STANDARD VERSION BIBLE

Sentence:

The Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd, and will guide them to the springs of the water of life, and God will wipe every tear from their eyes.

Revelation 7: 17

Acts 9: 36-43

³⁶Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. ³⁷At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. ³⁸Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, "Please come to us without delay." ³⁹So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. ⁴⁰Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, get up." Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. ⁴¹He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. ⁴²This became known throughout Joppa, and many

believed in the Lord. ⁴³Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

- ⁹After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. ¹⁰They cried out in a loud voice, saying,
"Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!"
¹¹And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, ¹²singing,
"Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and

thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen."

¹³Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" ¹⁴I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

¹⁵For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them.

¹⁶They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; ¹⁷for the Lamb at the centre of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

²²At that time the festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, ²³and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. ²⁴So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly." ²⁵Jesus answered, "I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; ²⁶but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep. ²⁷My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. ²⁹What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand. ³⁰The Father and I are one."

FROM YOUR ACTING-DEAN ...

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself a little more. Having recently moved to the Hawke's Bay I am a not known to many.

I am married to Sue (20 years this past week), and we have 3 wonderful children – Rebekah (17), Anna (15), Alex (12).

My father arrived in Havelock North in 1952, post World War Europe, my mother is from Western Australia.

The role of Regional Dean in the Hawke's Bay is:

To fulfil the duties of Bishop's Chaplain, as Bishop's representative and an extension of his Episcopal ministry, by enabling for local shared and team ministries, building a sense of regional identity and partnership, working pro-actively in bicultural partnerships, helping lay and clergy members of the Diocese to develop their ministry skills and knowledge, encouraging new areas of mission and ministry, and initiating regional events for Anglicans in the region.

I have broken this down to 8 key themes that are achievable:

- 1 Accept that I am the person for the job!!**
- 2** Seek to understand the landscape.
 - a. Be a servant leader.
 - b. At all levels – cultural, emotional, and spiritual.
 - c. Develop empathy and trust, building security.
- 3** Communication – speak up and make a stand.
 - a. Be a bridge with transparency.
 - b. Have a high degree of consistency.
- 4** Bishop – to continue communication openly with public loyalty.
 - a. When Bishop not present, clearly report back.

- b. Keep everyone, especially the senior leadership team, fully informed.
 - c. An absolute policy of no surprises.
 - d. Value very frank discussion behind closed doors.
- 5** Flexibility – problem solving by delegation.
 - a. Share in problem solving.
 - b. Work collaboratively.
- 6** Work / Life Balance.
 - a. Find ways to maintain a good healthy balance and perspective of key issues.
- 7** Leading and leadership role.
 - a. Coaching in the team.
 - b. Not being afraid to have difficult / courageous conversations.
 - c. Innovation – what are the customer base issues?
 - d. Training and teaching role of empowerment.
- 8** Team / Teamwork.
 - a. Understanding my role within the team.
 - b. Fast and efficient communication.
 - c. Help other team members succeed.
 - d. Bring outside perspective.

As Regional Dean I have been asked by Bp. Andrew to come to the Cathedral whilst Dean Michael is on leave. As Priest in Charge / Acting Dean I will use these 8 themes to shape my time here.

I have enjoyed this week getting to meet as many of you as possible. I would like to thank the Rev'ds Dorothy and Margaret for so ably helping me settle in.

Over the next couple of weeks I will look forward to getting to know more of you and will be joined by my family in worship as often as they are able.

This stage production, presented by the Kahurangi Maori Dance Company, is a 60min performance based on a collection of stories and memoirs of the late **Rev'd Canon Wi Te Tau Huata**.

As a young man, Koro Wi enlisted for service in WWII as a Chaplain (3rd Generation Anglican Minister), in June 1943. After briefly training as a soldier at Trentham Military Camp he sailed with the 10th Re-enforcements to Egypt, to join the 28th Maori Battalion with a rank of Captain, in July of that year.

Koro Wi had many duties as a Padre and Officer and was often seen searching the battlefield for wounded and bodies amongst the debris of shelling and small fire-arms, for which he would later receive a Military Cross (which he gifted to the St. Matthews Anglican Church Parish, Paki Paki where it is displayed today.)

This production is a tribute by the Kahurangi Artistic Director, late Tama Turanga Huata to his father, Canon Wi Te Tau Huata.
