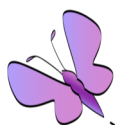

⁹During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." ¹⁰When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.

¹¹We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, ¹²and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. ¹³On the Sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. ¹⁴A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. ¹⁵When she and her house-

FROM THE ACTING-DEAN ...

This morning (Wednesday) I was struck by two Facebook posts:

"Jesus deserves the best of our time and energy so he can change us beyond all recognition. *Archbishop Justin Welby*."

"Not all white collar jobs are equal. When you see someone wearing one of these (clerical collar / dog-collar), pray for them. We're over our heads and need help ... even if we act as though we are fine. Please pray for your clergy today."

There were probably several reasons these struck a chord, but most significantly because I was wrestling with a sermon concept and drafting a report to Vestry.

The readings for Easter 5 and Easter 6 call us to love one another. But not just any kind of love, a new kind of love, a Jesus-like love. And then to make it matter more, the rubber really hits the road, in what we would today call a measurable outcome: "Everyone will know you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

As Christians we are being watched, and not always judgementally but more often to set the tone, to lead the way, to model what life could be like in a world filled with Jesus-like love.

This is not easy, especially in a time and place so fraught with issues of angst. Can we show the world that we love difference and otherness and yet hold our Christian integrity? Are we willing to give Jesus the best of our time and energy and expect that we might just be changed beyond all recognition?

What are the glimpses of heaven that we have here on earth? Are we as individuals and congregation open to the realities that heaven is a Community, that heaven is a

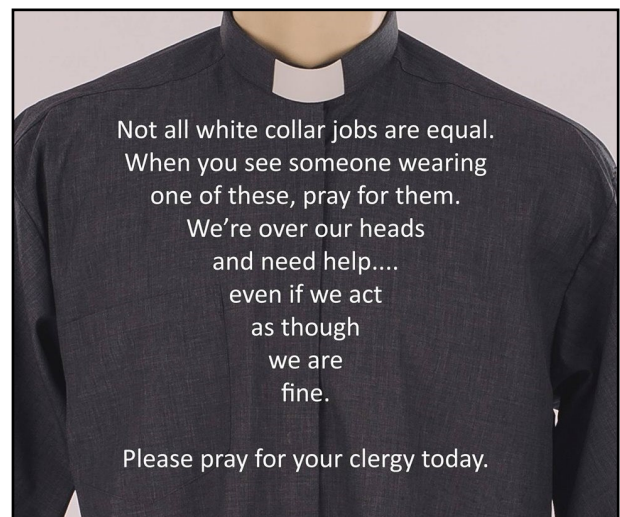
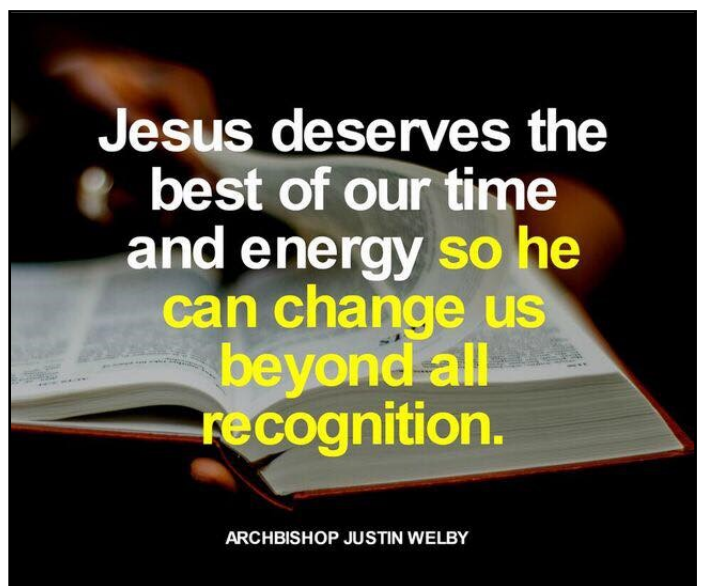
place of Healing, and that heaven is a place of Vision.

In this post-Easter season it seems to me that we are being called to love one another and show that outwardly to others by way of community, being a place of healing and a place of vision.

As we continue to be a place of resurrection, life, and hope in this place and we prepare to host General Synod I invite you not only to pray for Clergy, but for each other and those whom we will welcome to General Synod.
