**Bishop Andrew** has announced that he has received notice from the **Rev'd Adrienne Bruce** that she will retire from stipendiary ministry as Regional Dean in the Bay of Plenty at Christmas this year.

The Parish of Otumoetai has also received a letter advising them that the **Rev'd Arthur Bruce**, Vicar of Otumoetai, will also retire at Christmas this year.

Adrienne and Arthur have been generous with the time of the notice that they have given, allowing for the announcement their retirements now so that planning can get under way for new appointments to take up the ministries they both currently hold in the church.

Separate services will be held in December to acknowledge both Adrienne and Arthur in their respective ministries. Please uphold Adrienne and Arthur in your prayers during this time of transition into retirement.

**Sincere thanks** from Dean Ian and Wardens Alison and Graeme to all who gave their time and talents to our celebration of Pentecost which was enhanced by participation of students, Chaplain and staff of Woodford House school. Whether your offering was made quietly or "like the sound of a rushing wind" it all contributed to a memorable Sunday of music and colour.

**Vestry** met on Wednesday night, and Sub-committees have been reviewed and the bodies for 2018 will be: Finance; Works, Health & Safety; Hospitality; Fundraising & Projects; Youth, Children & Families; Social Activities. Ways to participate will be promoted as part of a Stewardship Programme which begins next month.

**Our Treasurer, Paul Anderson** has kindly agreed to become a full member of Vestry. This means that the number of Vestry members is still within the limits required by the Diocesan Canons.

**Nick Powrie** has resigned from the Works Committee after many years of service and Vestry requested that he be thanked publicly for his dedication to the Cathedral plant.

Vestry held a **retreat/planning** afternoon at the Deanery shortly before General Synod. This was largely to progress the indications we received of priorities at the 2018 AGM.

**Br. Graham-Michael OSBC** will be participating in Refugee Week (17-24 June) and would welcome online sponsorship of his living on "refugee rations" during that time. See the OXFAM poster near the tables at the entrance for details. He also invites expressions of interest in his support for Ugandan LGBTI refugees living in camps in Kenya. Vestry has agreed to this cause being endorsed by the Cathedral.

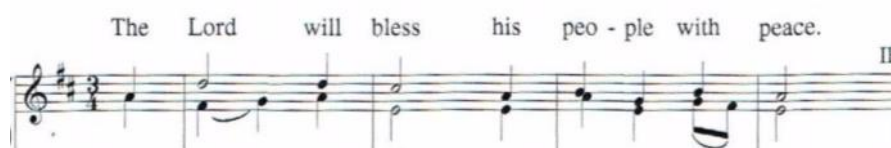
