The Napier Family Centre has this week opened a new 'Charity Shop' in the main shopping area of Taradale - 301 Gloucester Street, Taradale.

The NFC Charity Shop will focus on quality product offerings including fashion, homewares, children's items, and small furniture.

The shop will be largely run by the support of a dedicated team of volunteers who have been working hard to get the shop ready for last Monday's opening day. The money raised from sales through the shop will go back into supporting local children and families through social services.

The Napier Family Centre has a 35-year proven history supporting families to improve relationships and well-being through their work in Counselling, Early Childhood Education, Family social work support etc.

Dean Ian Render serves on the Board of the Napier Family Centre. The Cathedral Parish was actively involved with the establishment of the NFC and has continued to support its community work over the years.

Donations of goods can be dropped off at the shop, or via the loading zone in Symonds Lane behind the shop.

Shop hours are Monday-Friday 9.30am-4.30pm, and Saturday 9.30am-1pm.
