It was most fitting that Bishop Andrew led our parish Ash Wednesday eucharist and imposition of ashes, with attendance marginally more than last year. However, this year the Ecumenical Service on the same evening doubled in size to 173 people from Napier and Taradale, along with all the managers of Anglican Care who were gathered for their annual hui. Many people have remarked on how powerful a demonstration of Christian unity it was, and how moving to have clergy from the various parishes sharing together in the ashing of those who wished it.
