TE POUHERE SUNDAY (OUR CHURCH'S CONSTITUTION)

Welcome to all who are worshipping here today, especially Nga Kura o Hukarere me Te Aute. Today we are celebrating our return to the Cathedral building as a community of faith, and our recent return to freedom to gather.

*This morning's service follows the Eucharistic Liturgy '**Thanksgiving and Praise / Te Whakawhetai me te Whakamoemiti** . Congregational responses are in **bold type**. We include both Reo Pakeha me Reo Maori.*

The congregation remain seated while the choir sing an Introit from the baptistery, then all stand to sing the Processional Hymn.

We follow the order of service on the buff sheet
