Next Sunday 3 November we will once again be marking All Saints / All Souls as an opportunity to remember our loved ones who have died.

Each year, Diocesan Synods begin with the reading of the names of those who have passed away in the previous 12 months. We will follow this practice at our morning services on that Sunday, along with the opportunity to present (in writing) the names of any of our loved ones we wish to memorialize. **Clip boards are available at the rear of the Cathedral for this purpose.**

Once again we are partnering with Dunstall's Funeral Services to welcome all who want to participate in a service of remembrance at 5.00pm. All names will be read aloud at that service. If you have friends who are struggling with bereavement, this is an appropriate opportunity to invite them along.
