## ORDER OF SERVICE - 29 NOVEMBER 2020 1ST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

This morning's service follows the Eucharistic Liturgy 'Thanksgiving of the People of God commencing on page 404 in the New Zealand Prayer Book.

Congregational responses are in bold type.

The Season of Advent (the 4 Sundays before Christmas) is a time of preparation, prayer and fasting. We can choose the discipline of preparation in prayer before worship begins, rather than catching up with our neighbours! It is a wilderness time, dominated by the figure of John, who announced the coming of the Holy One, and who called upon God's people to repent of their sins.

We omit the Gloria, (the song of the Angels) until Christmas.
