IMPORTANT HEALTH NOTICE: Our Diocese has directed parishes to **refrain** from the practice of intinction (**dipping the wafer into the wine**). For health reasons please co-operate with this requirement. Receiving the bread only is still regarded as a full expression of the sacrament, or you can simply hold or receive the chalice and then pass it back to the person serving. *Intinction is less hygienic than the common cup.*

Sadly we are seeing more cases across the Diocese where parishioners are receiving either malicious phone calls or malicious emails. The emails often appear to come from people within the parish or Diocese (some even posing as the vicar!) and are extremely convincing. They ask you to respond to a plea for help and attempt to obtain bank details or money.

Please beware of these scams - they are fraudulent! Sender details of these suspicious emails appear very similar to real email addresses in order to try and gain your trust.

DO NOT respond to these emails! DO NOT hand over bank or credit card details. At no time would we ever ask for these sorts of details.
